Concept

Discover the secrets of the most mysterious and powerful knightly order of the Middle Ages; The Knights Templar. From the rise of their heavenly power through their fall within the flames of diabolism. From to the traditions of their supposed secret survival and their official legacies bridging the Holy Land and the European continent.

Summary

Templar knights in their distinctive white mantles with a red cross, brave in the face of death rather than fleeing from the enemy, fighting for Christ and the Pope in the Holy Land during the Crusades. This documentary series aims at reconstructing, for the first time, in a complete fashion the evolution of the knights belonging to the Order of Solomon's Temple, whose original goal was to protect pilgrims during their travels to Jerusalem after the victory of the Crusaders at the First Crusade. The Knights Templar grew in power and wealth becoming the earliest banking institution of the Middle Age. They were so rich that they financed the King of France and benefitted from a direct and exclusive link with the Pope. Through three episodes of 45 minutes each, you will discover the developments that led the Templars to extreme power and subsequently to becoming the target of an unprecedented campaign of hatred aiming to place them beyond the boundaries of humanity itself through inexpressible accusations of diabolism and monstrosity. Within two centuries, they were tortured, killed, burnt at the stake and completely extinct. The secrets and mysteries of their rise and fall will be attentively reconstructed by an accurate recourse to historical records which will also lead you through a time voyage in the period following the destruction of the Order. Discover legacies and mysterious traditions which claimed their posthumous survival.



Episode 1: The Rise and Fall of a Knightly Order

The Knights Templar were established as a special religious-military order by Hugues de Payens within the tradition of medieval knighthood, benefiting from a direct link with the king and the pope and distinguishing themselves by other knightly orders such as the Hospitallers or the Order of Malta. The rise and fall of the Order follow specific lines of developments and entail several secrets and mysteries, such as the financial donations to the Order, the survival of a supposedly very rich treasure, the rituals through which one could become a member, and eventually the fall of the Order under the attack of King Philip the Fair.

Episode 2: The Templars and the Devil ?

The Knights Templar become the target of specific accusations arranged by the French court. The charges employed against the Templars constitute one of the earliest examples of a massive use of both traditional and novel stereotypes for the destruction of a specific social group: homosexuality, blasphemy, diabolism, heresy, secret rituals and idols to be worshipped, to mention a few. If Jacques de Molay was burned at the stake as a heretic, other Templars managed to survive, especially – but not only – in Portugal.

Episode 3: The Templars after the Templars (or The Mysterious Legacy of the Templars)

The Knights Templar left a legacy, both visible in a consistent number of castles, villages, and abbeys throughout Europe, and invisible through the diffusion of long-lasting traditions claiming the survival of individuals belonging to the Order, with their array of secrets and riches. Rosslyn Chapel in Scotland is only one of the many mysterious places to which a strong continuity with the world of the Templars is attached.



1) We have access to the "Vatican's Secret Archives": We are talking about 85 kilometers of shelving which was only opened in 1881 to researchers and only with limited access. You need to be a qualified scholar from an institution of higher education pursuing scientific research and with an adequate knowledge of archival research just to apply for an entry card. Students are not even permitted. Even if you are accepted, there are strict limitations to what archive users are able to view and access.



2) First Team: We are the first team that will take a deep dive into the connection between the historical events and contemporary developments of the Knights Templar to construct a political and financial power.



3) Unpublished Topics: We will reveal unpublished topics in depth describing how it was even possible for them to raise so much money even the King was indebted to them, how it was even possible for them to become so powerful they worried the Pope and stimulated the appetites of the state and how it was even possible for them to be demolished in such a rapid amount of time. The same cause for them to flourish was the same cause of their demise. Heresy.




4) Access to the House of Hospitallers: The Sovereign Military Order of Malta, now based in Rome, is the present-day continuation of the medieval Knights Hospitaller, with origins in the Fraternitas Hospitalaria hospital founded circa 1048. Hospitallers are still active today and have resources and special jurisdictions that also issue their passports. We will try to understand why and possibly what is hidden behind this?


