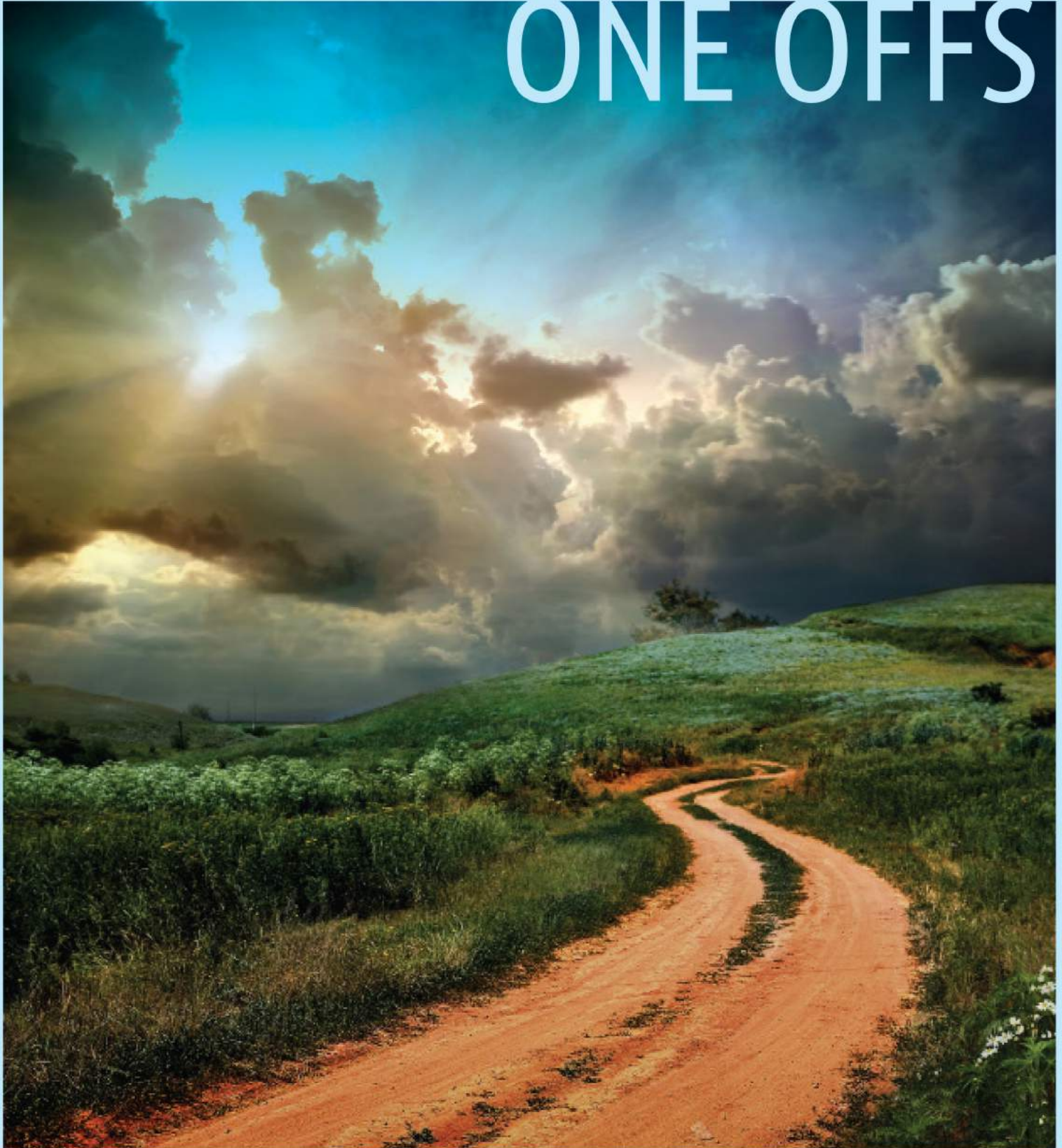

Another great challenge which has been on his mind for many years is to cross Antarctica over the South Pole.



pygmies - the children of the jungle

carstenz - the seventh summit

forgotten island

"Not far from Somalia in the Gulf of Aden there is an island that time forgot. The Socotra Island is desolate, rugged and austere beautiful. After decades of isolation a scientific expedition made an amazing archaeological discovery on the island in the depths of a sanctuary cave; a perfectly preserved wooden tablet with inscriptions in Aramean, the language spoken by Jesus Christ, dating from the third century AD. More than a third of Socotra's fauna and flora is endemic, and most of it remains unknown. This film unveils some fascinating geographical, historical and natural aspects of an island that shelters so many treasures."



tepuy - a journey to the depths of the earth

The film documentary TEPUY is a thrilling story that takes place deep in the middle of the Orinduik rainforest in Venezuela. Thank to its almost absolute inaccessibility, prehistoric forms of life have been preserved here that have survived for millions of years. In the gigantic labyrinth of the world's oldest rocks, colonies of bizarre organisms have built the largest quartzite cave in the world.
